Certified Enrollment for 2019:

The month of October is a busy one for schools across Iowa as they complete and file several required state reports. One of the most important, if not the most important, is the completion of our district certified enrollment. The district certified enrollment number is one of the main factors that determine our budget for the following fiscal year. This number, along with the percentage allocated by the state legislature as additional supplemental state aid, will establish the overwhelming majority of our general fund dollars available to educate our students. Our district enrollment numbers have increased by 7.42 students for the 2019-20 school year.

2018-19 certified enrollment: 987.38
2019-20 certified enrollment: 994.80

The OABCIG regular program district Cost Per Pupil for 2019-20 is \$6,880. This amount multiplied by the district certified enrollment becomes the amount of state aid that will be received during the 2020-21 school year as part of the general fund. The state legislature will set the 2020-21 cost per pupil during the 2020 Legislative Session.

The number of students open-enrolled into our district increased from 30.90 to 37.60. This is an increase of 6.70 students. The number of students who open-enroll out of the district decreased slightly from 57.2 to 57.0.

Facilities Update:

The district continues to work with our architect to finalize construction drawings for the upcoming construction projects. We anticipate these drawings to be completed by the end of January. At that time we will prepare bid packages for contractors with the plan that with acceptable bids the district could start construction by the end of April 2020.

The district is also exploring options to construct a new transportation center to replace the one that will be eliminated due to other construction improvements. This project will most likely run simultaneously with the projects being funded by the general obligation bond funding, but the transportation center will not be funded by the general obligation bond funds.

Upcoming Events:

The month of November will bring several opportunities to see our students showcase their talents. One of those events is the high school production of "The Sound of Music" with show times on Friday, November 15th at 7pm and on Sunday, November 17th at 2pm. You will want to make plans to watch one of these performances. You will not be disappointed.

Also, our volleyball and football teams have had great seasons and are continuing on in postseason play. The boys' cross country team finished 2nd in the conference. The FFA sent members to National Convention, and our elementary and middle school students have taken part in many activities including Red Ribbon Week, and visits to the Fire Department to name just a couple.

Vaping has become a popular alternative to cigarette smoking over the past decade. The negative effects of vaping/electronic cigarettes are increasing in teens and adults. According to the CDC, as of October 8, 2019, there were 1,299 confirmed and probable lung injury cases associated with the use of E-cigarette or vaping products were reported. There are still so many unknowns about the short and long term effects of these products. Below are links to resources. EMERGENCY SCHOOL CLOSING

Series 500

Code No. 501.18

The Superintendent of Schools shall have the authority to close schools because of extreme weather or other emergency conditions for the length of time the emergency exists. He shall make provisions to publicly announce such closings via available mass communication media as soon as possible after the decision to close.

Every reasonable effort shall be made to have the students attend the total days annually as specified by statute, state departmental rules and local school board policy.

POLICY FOR ACTIVITIES DURING EMERGENCY SCHOOL CLOSINGS

Series 500

Code No. 501.19

In the event of school being dismissed because of inclement weather, the following guidelines will be followed:

(Inclement weather is weather that would be hazardous for students to travel in – such as snow and/or ice.)

1. If school is dismissed after it is in session for inclement weather, all activities will be cancelled for the remainder of that day.
2. If school is not in session on a particular day due to inclement weather, there shall be no practice or other activities* that day.
3. *Varsity contests may be played if the superintendent grants permission. (This permission will only be given after consulting with the Board President/Vice President.

Factors to consider are if weather conditions have improved, the distance between the schools, and the importance of the contest. Approval should be the exception rather than the rule.)

In the event of school being dismissed because of heat and humidity in the classrooms, the following guideline will be followed:

1. The Superintendent will determine if practice or activities will be held after consulting with the School Board President/Vice President.
2. If practices are held, all coaches will make sure that all precautions are taken to ensure that all athletes will have ample rest and water breaks.

STUDENT CONDUCT ON SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION

Series 700 Code No. 711.2

Students utilizing school transportation will conduct themselves in an orderly manner fitting to their age level and maturity with mutual respect and consideration for the rights of the school vehicle driver and the other passengers. Students who fail to behave in an orderly manner will be subject to disciplinary measures.

The driver will have the authority to maintain order on the school vehicle. It is the responsibility of the driver to report misconduct to the building administrator. After three warnings for bad conduct, the building principal will have the authority to suspend

transportation privileges of the student or impose other appropriate discipline.

It is the responsibility of the superintendent, in conjunction with the building principal, to develop administrative regulations regarding student conduct and discipline when utilizing school district transportation.
